As part of the enhancement of the Ebbw Fach Trail, work has taken place at the Woodlands site. Some of this work is shown in the adjacent photos.

<u>Top Left</u> - Enhancement of Highlands Road Entrance, where three Interpretation Posts have been erected, from which you can find information about the site, and these include an 'audio' panel.






<u>Top Right</u> - Higher 'cattle proof' fencing erected at the north end of Upper Boat Pond

Bottom Left - The vandalised Dragonfly Gate has now been repaired.

Bottom Right - A new bridge was built near the Blaen Cendl Entrance and heathers were replanted at the entrance gate.

<u>Keep Wales Tidy -Tidy Towns Week :-</u> John Hillier - Woodlands Director and Welsh Baccalaureate Coordinator organised an activity to support the "Keep Wales Tidy Towns" initiative. The idea was to engage pupils of the local schools to assist with the development and upkeep of the Woodlands. Activities consisted of a general litter pick and collection of coppiced materials for chipping. The chipped wood was used to re-establish the outdoor classroom log circle, which was unfortunately vandalised during the summer, and to establish informal woodland pathways. The activity took place on Sept 22nd 2012 at the Woodlands. Six pupils from Ebbw Fawr Learning Community volunteered their services as well as two pupils from Beaufort Hill Primary School . <u>Left</u>:- Members received training in making willow fencing and then constructed a bird hide on the north bank of the Lower Boat Pond.

<u>Right</u>:- Four 'sleeper bridges ' were constructed and then installed over ditches on some of the informal paths around the woodlands.

A third wood sculpture created by local wood carver John James , has been erected at the junction of the paths, near the Upper Boat Pond.



A Notice Board was installed at the Highlands Road Entrance, courtesy of funding from G.A.V.O and Beaufort Hill Miners Welfare Trust.



Two Interpretation Panels, showing the wildfowl that visit the ponds & woodands, will shortly be installed on the banks of both Boat Ponds. This has been funded by a grant from the Big Lottery Fund.



A wood chipper was purchased as part of a grant from Environment Wales and coppiced trimmings were shredded to produce a mulch, which was then spread over the informal path running from Highlands Road Entrance towards the Blaen Cendl entrance.
